Market commentary

The final quarter of 2018 was challenging for the equity market with sell-offs accelerating through to the end of December. US equities had their worst quarterly performance since 2011 due to a host of economic and geopolitical factors. UK equities fell, in part due to weaker sterling and uncertainty around Brexit. European equities slightly outperformed US stocks but still fell during the quarter. Asia Pacific equities were not immune to the worsening market environment but did manage to outperform North American and European equities. A small number of central banks including the US Federal Reserve raised interest rates in the quarter, however future raises have been put in doubt due to falling growth. Gilt yields were volatile through the quarter but performed well overall, posting a positive return and outpacing eurozone debt. Global government bonds posted positive returns for the first time in three quarters lead by returns from the US. Corporate bond returns were not as favourable with tighter liquidity requirements, increasing geopolitical risk, and signs of a growth slowdown hurting the asset class.
